

1.1 Overview of Type I Bullet Camera




Figure 1-1 Type I Bullet Camera

- Type I camera does not support the function of Wi-Fi or SD card.
- Press Reset button about 10s when the camera is power on or rebooting to restore the default settings, including the user name, password, IP address, port No., etc.




Figure 1-2 Type II Bullet Camera

- This type of bullet camera supports PoE power supply. You can power the camera by connecting both DC 12V interface and the Ethernet interface. Or you can connect the Ethernet interface only.
- WPS/RESET Button

WPS function and Reset function share the same button. The button works as a reset button only when you press it when the camera is powered on.

1.2.1 Resetting the Camera

Press WPS/RESET button about 10s when the camera is power on or rebooting to restore the default settings, including the user name, password, IP address, port No., etc.

1.2.2 Setting the WPS Protocol

A wireless router with the WPS function is required to enable the WPS function of the camera. Refer the steps below.

Steps:

- Enable the WPS function of your router. Refer to the operation guide of your router for detailed procedures.
- Press the WPS/RESET button (about 2s) on the camera to join in the wireless network.




Figure 1-4 WPS/RESET Button



You can also press the WPS button on the camera first and then enable the WPS function on the router to establish the connection. But the WPS function of the router must be turned on within 120s right after pressing the WPS/RESET button on the camera.

1.3 Overview of Type III Bullet Camera




Figure 1-5 Type III Bullet Camera

- This type of bullet camera supports PoE power supply. You can power the camera by connecting both DC 12V interface and the Ethernet interface. Or you can connect the Ethernet interface only.
- Press and hold the reset button about 10s when the camera is powering on or rebooting to restore the default settings, including the user name, password, IP address, port No., etc.

2 Installation

Before you start:

- Make sure the device in the package is in good condition and all the assembly parts are included.
- The standard power supply is 12V DC or 24V AC, please make sure your power supply matches with your camera.
- Make sure all the related equipment is power-off during the installation.
- Check the specification of the products for the installation environment.
- Make sure that the wall is strong enough to withstand four times the weight of the camera and the bracket.

For the camera that supports IR, you are required to pay attention to the following precautions to prevent IR reflection:

- Dust or grease on the dome cover will cause IR reflection.
 Please do not remove the dome cover film until the installation is finished. If there is dust or grease on the dome cover, clean the dome cover with clean soft cloth and isopropyl alcohol.
- Make sure that there is no reflective surface too close to the camera lens. The IR light from the camera may reflect back into the lens causing reflection.
- The foam ring around the lens must be seated flush against the inner surface of the bubble to isolate the lens from the IR LEDS.
 Fasten the dome cover to camera body so that the foam ring and the dome cover are attached seamlessly.

2.1 Installation of Memory Card

Type II and Type III camera support memory card function. Follow the steps to mount and unmount a memory card.

Steps:

1. Unscrew the cover on back case to expose memory card slot.

2. Insert the memory card into the memory card slot.




Figure 2-2 Insert Memory Card

- 3. (Optional)To unmount the memory card, push to get it ejected.
- 4. Screw the cover back to the camera.

2.2 Installation of the Bullet Camera



Both wall mounting and ceiling mounting are suitable for the bullet camera. Wall mounting will be taken as an example in this section. You can take steps of wall mounting as a reference if ceiling mounting is adopted.

Steps:

1. Drill the screw holes in the wall according to the drill template.




Figure 2-3 Drill Template

- 2. Route the corresponding cables.
- 3. Secure the camera to the wall with the supplied Screws.




Figure 2-4 Secure the Camera to the Ceiling

- Connect the cables and power on the camera to view live view image.
- 5. Adjust the surveillance angle.




Figure 2-5 3-axis Adjustment

- 1). Loosen the adjusting nut.
- 2). Adjust the pan direction [0° to 360°].
- 3). Adjust the tilt direction [0° to 90°].
- Rotate the camera [0° to 360°] to adjust the lens to the surveillance angle.
- 5). Tighten the adjusting nut to complete the installation.

2.3 Installation of Network Cable Water-proof Jacket (Optional)

Purpose:

If the camera is installed outdoor, you can adapt the water-proof accessory for the network cable after the camera is secured on the installation surface




Figure 2-6 Water-proof Accessory Components




Figure 2-7 Water-proof Accessory Installation

Steps:

- Feed the plugless network cable ? through the lock nut 6, waterproof rubber gasket (\$\frac{1}{3}\$) (rubber gasket inset ridge must face waterproof endcap), and the water-proof endcap 4 in order.
- Crimp an RJ-45 network plug 3 onto the end of the cable, taking care to insert the twisted pairs of wires in correct order.
- Place the O-type gasket ② onto the end of the camera's network interface socket ①.
- Insert the network plug (3) into the camera's network interface socket (1).
- Insert the water-proof rubber gasket (5) into the water-proof endcap (4), and secure lock nut (6) with the water-proof endcap (4).
- 6. Align the snap on the water-proof endcap with the notch on the camera's network interface socket n, and then secure the water-proof endcap to the camera's network interface socket to finish installation.

3 Setting the Network Camera over the LAN

Note:

3.1 Wiring

Connect the camera to network according to the following figures.




Figure 3-2 Connecting via a Switch or a Router

3.2 Activating the Camera

You are required to activate the camera first by setting a strong password for it before you can use the camera.

Activation via Web Browser, Activation via SADP, and Activation via Client Software are all supported. We will take activation via SADP software and Activation via Web Browser as examples to introduce the camera activation.

Note:

Refer to the User Manual of Network Camera for Activation via Client Software.

3.2.1 Activation via Web Browser

Steps:

- Power on the camera. Connect the camera to your computer or the switch/router which your computer connects to.
- Input the IP address into the address bar of the web browser, and press Enter to enter the activation interface.

Notes:

- The default IP address of the camera is 192.168.1.64.
- The computer and the camera should belong to the same subnet
- For the camera enables the DHCP by default, you need to use the SADP software to search the IP address.

Create a password and input the password into the password field.



STRONG PASSWORD RECOMMENDED— We highly recommend you create a strong password of your own choosing (using a minimum of 8 characters, including upper case letters, lower case letters, numbers, and special characters) in order to increase the security of your product. And we recommend you reset your password regularly, especially in the high security system, resetting the password monthly or weekly can better protect your product.

- 4. Confirm the password.
- 5. Click **OK** to save the password and enter the live view interface.

3.2.2 Activation via SADP Software

SADP software is used for detecting the online device, activating the camera, and resetting the password.

Get the SADP software from the supplied disk or the official website, and install the SADP according to the prompts. Follow the steps to activate the camera, please refer to the User Manual of Network Camera for other two activation methods.

Steps:

- Run the SADP software to search the online devices.
- Check the device status from the device list, and select the inactive device.

Note:

The SADP software supports activating the camera in batch. Refer to the user manual of SADP software for details

Create and input the new password in the password field, and confirm the password.

Note:

You can enable the STGO2 service for the device during activation. Refer to Chapter 5.1 for detailed information.

4. Click Activate to start activation.

You can check whether the activation is completed on the popup window. If activation failed, make sure that the password meets the requirement and try again.

3.3 Modifying the IP Address

Purpose:

To view and configure the camera via LAN (Local Area Network), you need to connect the network camera in the same subnet with your PC.

Use the SADP software or client software to search and change the IP address of the device. We take modifying the IP Address via SADP software as an example to introduce the IP address modification.

For IP address modification via client software, refer to the user

Steps:

- Run the SADP software.
- Select an activate device.
- Change the device IP address to the same subnet with your computer by either modifying the IP address manually or checking the checkbox of Fnable DHCP

Note:

You can enable the STGO2 service for the device during activation. Refer to Chapter 5.1 for detailed information.

 Input the admin password and click Modify to activate your IP address modification.

The batch IP address modification is supported by the SADP. Please refer to the User Manual of SADP for details.

4 Accessing via Web Browser

System Requirement:

Operating System: Microsoft Windows XP SP1 and above version

CPU: 2.0 GHz or higher

RAM: 1G or higher

Display: 1024×768 resolution or higher

Web Browser: Internet Explorer 8.0 and above version, Apple Safari 5.0.2 and above version, Mozilla Firefox 5.0 and above version and Google Chrome 18 and above version

Steps:

- 1. Open the web browser.
- In the browser address bar, input the IP address of the network camera, and press the Enter key to enter the login interface.

Note:

- The default IP address is 192.168.1.64. You are recommended to change the IP address to the same subnet with your computer.
- 3. Input the user name and password.

The admin user should configure the device accounts and user/operator permissions properly. Delete the unnecessary accounts and user/operator permissions.

Note:

The device IP address gets locked if the admin user performs 7 failed password attempts (5 attempts for the user/operator).

4. Click Login.

You may have to close the web browser to finish the installation of the plug-in.

5 Operating via Guarding Vision/STGO2

Purpose:

STGO2 is an application for mobile devices. With the App, you can view live image of the camera, receive alarm notification and so on.

Note:

STGO2 service is not supported by certain camera models.

5.1Enable STGO2 Service on Camera

Purpose:

STGO2 service should be enabled on your camera before using the service. You can enable the service through SADP software or web browser.

5.1.1 Enable STGO2 Service via SADP Software

Steps:

- Check the checkbox of Enable Guarding Vision/STGO2 on:
 - "Activate the Device" page during camera activation, refer to Chapter 3.2.2.
 - Or "Modify Network Parameters" page during modifying IP address, refer to Chapter 3.3.
- 2. Create a verification code or change the verification code.




Figure 5-1 Verification Code Setting (SADP)

Note:

The verification code is required when you add the camera to STGO2 app.

- 3. Click and read "Terms of Service" and "Privacy Policy".
- 4. Confirm the settings.

5.1.2 Enable STGO2 Service via Web Browser

Before you start:

You need to activate the camera before enabling the service. Refer to Chapter 3.2.

Steps:

- 1. Access the camera through web browser. Refer to Chapter 4.
- Enter platform access configuration interface: Configuration > Network > Advanced Settings > Platform Access

- 3. Select Platform Access Mode as Guarding Vision.
- 4 Check the checkbox of Enable
- Click and read "Terms of Service" and "Privacy Policy" in pop-up window.
- Create a verification code or change the verification code for the camera.

Note:

The verification code is required when you add the camera to STGO2 app.

7. Save the settings.

5.2 STGO2 Setup

Steps:

- Download and install the STGO2 app by searching "STGO2" in App Store or Google PlayTM.
- 2. Launch the app and register for a STGO2 user account.
- 3. Log in STGO2 app after registration.

5.3 Adding Camera to STGO2

Before you start:

You need to enable the STGO2 service on camera before adding it to your STGO2 account. Refer to Chapter 5.1.

Steps:

 Use a network cable to connect the camera with a router if the camera does not support Wi-Fi.

Note:

After the camera connects to the network, please wait one minute before any operation on the camera using STGO2 app.

In the STGO2 app, tap "+" on the upper-right corner and then scan the QR code of the camera to add the camera.

You can find the QR code on the camera or on the cover of the Quick Start Guide of the camera in the package.




Figure 5-4 Scan QR Code

Note:

If the QR code is missing or too blur to be recognized, you can also add the camera by tapping the icon and inputting the camera's serial number.

3. Input the verification code of your camera.

Note:

- The required verification code is the code you create or change when you enabling STGO2 service on camera.
- If you forget the verification code, you can check the current verification code on Platform Access configuration page via web browser.
- Follow the prompts to set the network connection and add the camera to your STGO2 account.

Note:

For detailed information, refer to the user manual of the STGO2 app.

5.4 Initializing the Memory Card

Steps:

Check the memory card status by tapping on the Storage Status in the Device Settings interface.

If the memory card status displays as Uninitialized, tap to initialize it. The status will then change to Normal. You can then start recording any event triggered video in the camera such as motion detection.

Securitytronix. (the "Company") warrants to the Original Purchaser that the Fixed Camera is free from defects in workmanship or material under normal use. This warranty starts on the date of shipment of the hardware to the Original Purchaser.

During the warranty period, the Company agrees to repair or replace, at its sole option, without charge to Original Purchaser, any defective component in the Fixed Camera. To obtain service, the Original Purchaser must return the Fixed Camera to the Company properly packaged for shipping. All defective products must be returned to the Company within thirty (30) days of failure. Products must be returned with a description of the failure and Return Merchandise Authorization (RMA) number supplied by the Company, To receive a RMA number and a return shipping address on where to deliver the hardware, call 610-429-1821. The shipping, and insurance charges incurred in shipping to the Company will be paid by Original Purchaser, and all risk for the hardware shall remain with the Original Purchaser until such time as Company takes receipt of the hardware. Upon receipt, the Company mill promptly repair or replace the defective unit, and then return said unit to Original Purchaser, shipping prepaid. The Company may use reconditioned or like-new parts or units, at its sole option, when repairing any hardware.
